SUSTAINABILITY

The Shore Regional Board of Education recognizes the importance of conserving natural resources and practicing responsible environmental management. The District endeavors to promote a high quality environment that promotes health and productivity for all and the effective management of fiscal resources.

The Board of Education agrees that the Superintendent, Business Administrator, faculty, and staff will be responsible for developing a resource management program which includes strategies for implementing effective and sustainable resource practices.

Through implementation of the following practices, the management team proposes:

- 1) Education in sustainability practices across the curriculum.
- 2) To minimize utility costs through the exploration of renewable and clean energy technology.
- 3) To reduce consumable waste by fully utilizing all materials before disposal; recycling; reducing the use of consumable materials; and, the use of biodegradable products.
- 4) To promote healthy food choices, promote locally grown food, plant a school garden and compost organic refuse.

A committee set by the Board of Education, composed of representatives from the Board, faculty, staff, and students will be responsible for planning and implementing the Sustainability Policy, as well as an annual Sustainability Plan and necessary reports.
