Though meals will be free for all students, completion of Free and Reduced Applications is still very important this year. The benefits for your student and the district extend beyond just free or reduced priced meals. Additional benefits may include:

- Reduced registration fees for AP, SAT, and/or ACT tests
- Free or discounted fees to participate in activities
- Qualification for discounted rates associated with college application
- Qualification for discounted rates on internet services
- School funding for counseling services, social workers, and paraprofessionals
- Increased funding to help with class size and technology
- Early childhood education funding
- Qualification for P-EBT benefits

Social Distancing Measures – When students eat in our cafeteria, they will find seating, floor markings and other space configurations that promote social distancing. We will also be working closely with the school on the number of students that are in the cafeteria at a single time.
